TAGGING SHIFT ON THE "FOUNDING OF QUEBEC CITY" SOUVENIR SHEET


WPS member Fred Altvater has provided a scan of a tagging error he has found on the France produced joint issue souvenir sheet for the 400th anniversary of the founding of Quebec City.

The shift is pretty spectacular as it just touches the top left and top right corners of the 0,85E stamp. Fred has highlighted the shift for readers. As Fred notes:

"Of the 5 sheets which I purchased, 1 sheet has a major shift on the tagging of the french (0,85 E) stamp. The tagging is such that there is only 5mm of tag on the top right and top left



We have 2 new members, Gabriel Larrivee and Diane Gammage.


