As a standing order customer of Finland, I receive quarterly information sheets (in English) of the upcoming issues. The Stamp info issue of 2/2010 features the booklet called Funny Vegetables shown below. Eight vegetables, tomato, onions, pumpkin, cucumber, egg plant, carrot, broccoli and potato are featured in different shapes, all denominated as 1kl or first class postage (€0.80). All of the stamps are safety perforated with stamp gum that is not water-soluble. 400,000 of these booklets were produced.

What you don't see in the picture below, is that on the inside of the booklet are a series of stickers designed to be applied to the face of the stamps to create "Potato Head" type personalized stamps. The stickers provide different eyes, ears, mouths, moustaches and wardrobe changes for the vegetables. The front cover below shows two potential stamps using the stickers provided.

Over the years, the Finnish Post Office has been very innovative in producing leading edge stamp designs. In 2008, the stamp design below was printed on clear acrylic making the envelope colour, the background colour for the issue.



Also in 2008, they produced the souvenir sheet below using the lenticular technology featured on Canada Post's tribute to the 100th anniversary of the Montreal



Canadiens in 2009.



As a mentor to youth stamp clubs, the subject of how to identify postage stamps is one of the first points of business. If you tell a novice collector that a postage stamp must have a legit country name and a currency valuation, you have already eliminated at least 90-95% of the cinderella stamps from the confusion.

I have seen many Cinderella stamps and in very few instances is the issuer trying to portray their stamp as anything other than a stamp produced for a specific function. The exceptions would be those stamps issued by fake postal authorities such as Staffa, Scotland and Ïso, Sverige and even those stamps have values added but with no denomination designation.

Exhibit A

Does the writer of this letter also include the revenue stamps of Canada as 'tramp' stamps? I present Exhibit A, an over printed 1867 Law stamp from Ontario that was used for the Fee Fund (FF). The artistry and the printing by the American Bank Note company are exquisite.



Exhibit B

I would also like to present the pair of poster stamps to the right advertising an International Exposition in Milan in 1906 as exhibit B.



I would submit that the artistic design, printing and content as good or better than any other stamps of this era.

StampShow'10 is rapidly approaching. It will be held at the Sunova Centre on April 30, May 1st and 2nd. For those wishing to exhibit, revenue stamps and stamped revenue paper have a different display classification from traditional postage stamps. All other Cinderella stamps, such as poster stamps, deposit stamps, charity stamps, etc fall into the Cinderella display classification. All exhibits are judged using the same parameters and can be exhibited in either 1 frame or multiple frame exhibits.
